Whether you are just visiting or are new to Ave Maria, we welcome you to Ave Maria Catholic Church.

People often attend Mass at a parish for months or years without officially registering. Parish registration is an expression of your commitment to being an active member of our community. Parish registration also simplifies the process with regard to religious education; sponsoring a sacramental candidate; and for the planning and preparation of baptisms, weddings, and funerals. Registration may be completed online or at the parish office.

We also need your help to keep our records current. In case of moves, births, deaths and marriages in your family, please notify the parish office or update your family information through ParishSoft.

Sacrament Preparation and Religious Education

First Communion

First Communion and First Confession preparation is a two year process, requiring a year of religious education before the year of preparation for the sacraments. This usually takes place during first and second grade, with the child receiving First Communion at the end of his second grade year. A child *must* be 6 years old to start the first year of preparation and 7 years old to start the second year. Children receiving religious education in school still need to register for the parish program.

Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion

Please call the parish office for a priest to schedule a visit.

Baptism Preparation

Baptism marks the beginning of the life of faith. Before requesting the sacrament of baptism, parents of a child to be baptized must be registered for at least one month and active members of Ave Maria Parish. We recommend you contact us prior to the birth of your child so you have time to prepare for this very special event.

Marriage

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months in advance. You must be a registered parishioner of Ave Maria Parish and have been attending Mass for at least 3 months. Call the parish office for more information.



Confirmation

Confirmation is a two year process, requiring one year of the Ave Maria youth group in 9th grade and one year of Confirmation classes in 10th grade. Students receiving religious education in school still need to register for the parish Confirmation class.

Adults needing the sacrament of confirmation should contact Arielle Harms for information about adult confirmation classes.

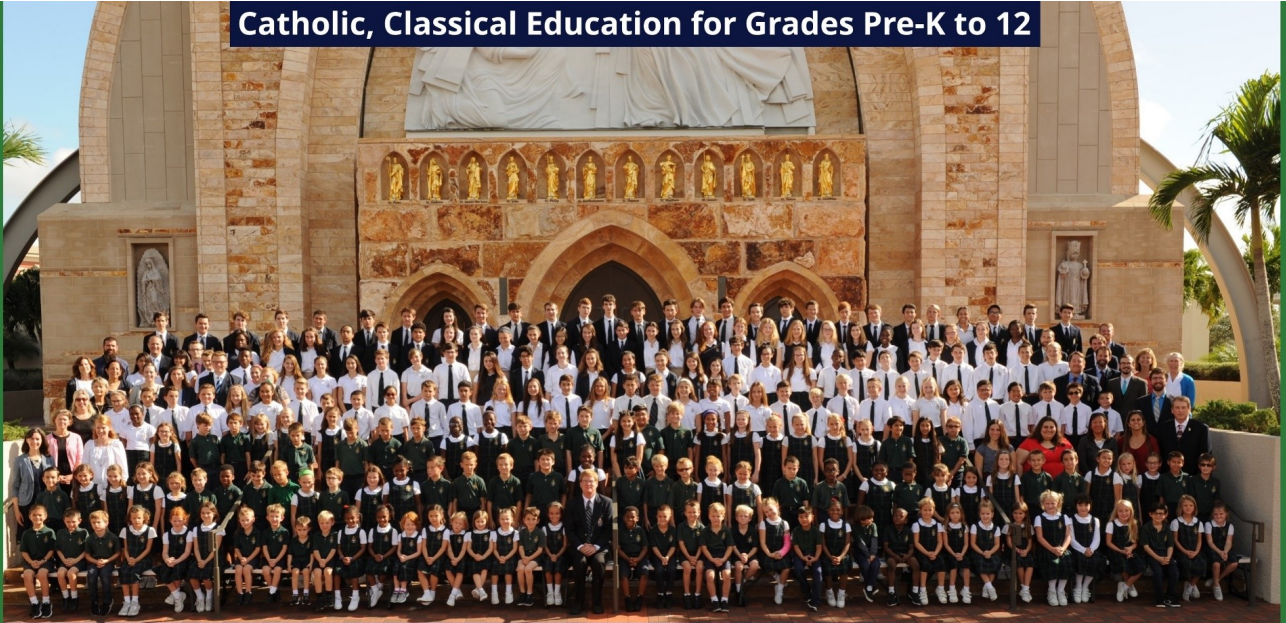

Confessions in the Church

Starting Wednesday, May 20, Confessions will be held in the Church at the regular times: Wednesday 2:45-3:45 pm and Saturday 9:30-10:30 am.

According to the newest directives from the diocese, Confessions will not be held in the confessionals. In order to keep confessions private and allow for appropriate distancing, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Enter through the doors near the ramp on the north side of the Church
- Lines form along the north side aisle of the Church: for the front confession station, starting under the second station of the cross and spacing 6 feet apart to the back of the Church; for the back confession station, starting under the seventh station of the cross and spacing 6 feet apart toward the front of the Church.
- Priests will be hearing confessions behind screens on the south side of the Church, in the front and back corners
- Once you have been to confession, exit by moving through the south side aisle to the middle cross aisle, exiting out the doors you came in
- Please do not remain in the church to pray after confession, as we will not have staff for cleaning.

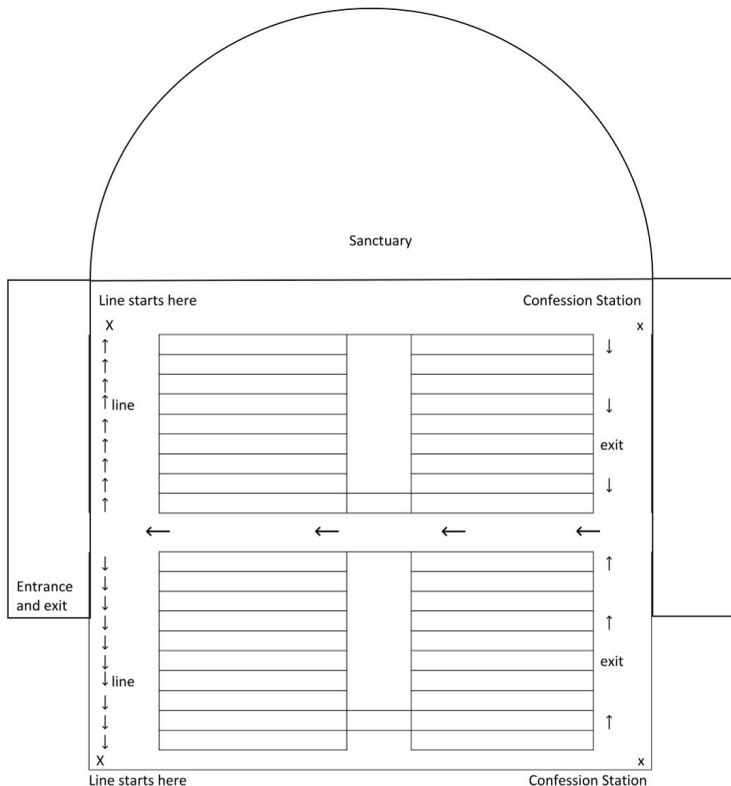

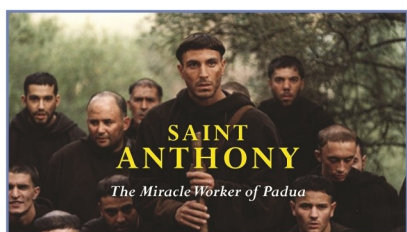
